SHOULDER TAP

- Discuss potential interns with existing interns; these may be friends of theirs.
- Have existing interns share their experience with potential interns, inviting them to consider an internship themselves.

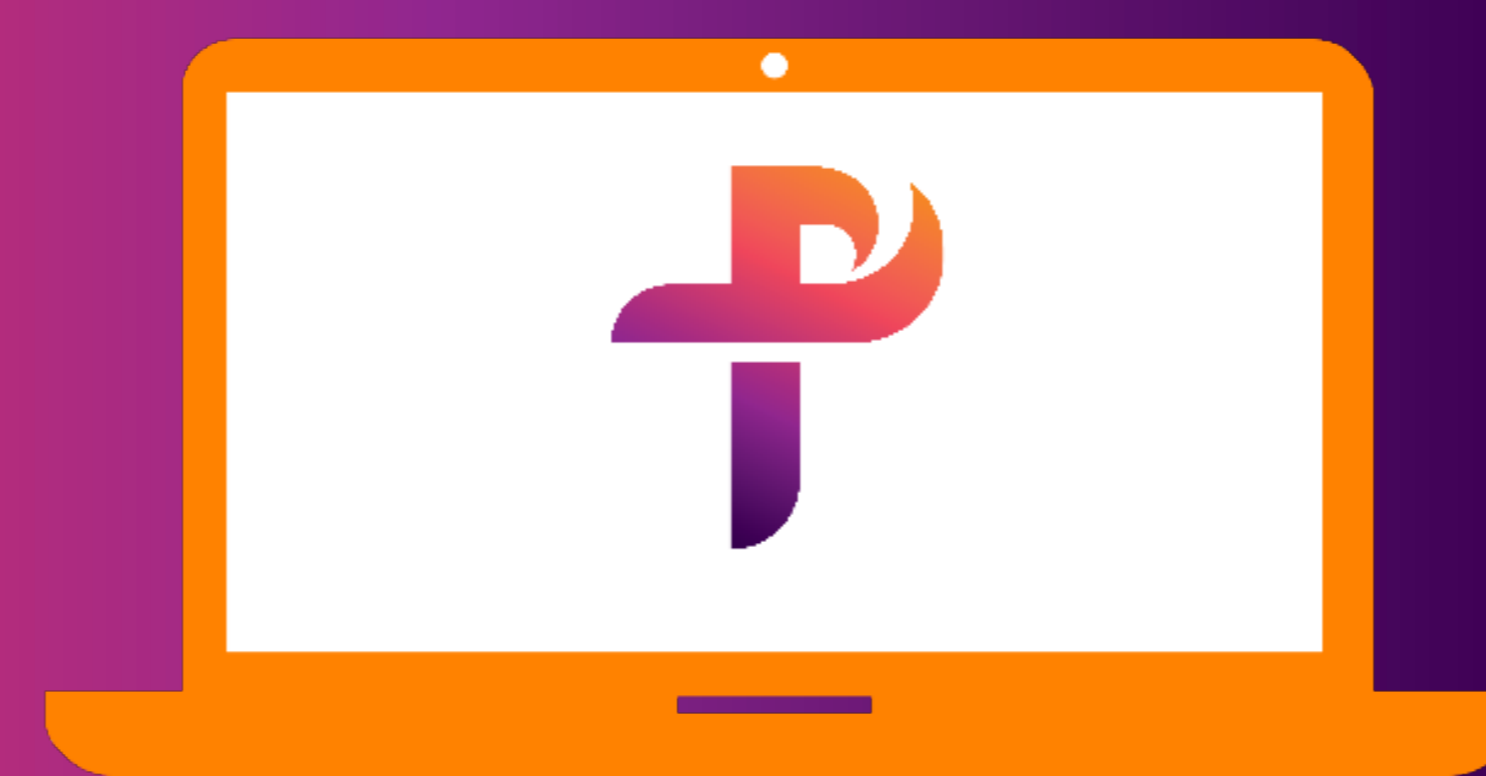
ADVERTISE
